

In the name of God, amen. I Carol Cameron being in good bodily health; and of sound mind and memory calling to mind the frailty and uncertainty of human life; and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs and directing how the estates with which, it has pleased God to bless me, shall be disposed of after my decease; while I have strength and capacity so to do; do make and publish this my last will and testament.

And first I commend my immortal being to him who gave it; and my body to the earth to be buried by my executors and friends in the usual way.

And as to my worldly estate and all other property real and personal of which I shall die seized and possessed or to which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease, I devise bequeath and dispose thereof in the manner following.

To wit. My will is that all my just debts and funeral charges shall by my executors hereinafter named be paid out of my estate as soon after my decease as shall by them be found convenient.

I give devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Amada Cameron the tract of Land on which I now live containing Two hundred and sixty acres more or less, and also two negro girls by names Antinitt about Twelve years of age, and Adaline about eight years of age, to have and to hold the above named property so long as she shall remain unmarried and my widow. Should she marry I then devise that my property all be sold and divided between my wife and children as the Law directs, Should she remain—

single untill the time of her death she is to remain in free and full possession of all the property before mentioned and bequeathed. And at her death the property then to be sold and the proceeds to be equally divided between my children for the use of them and their heirs forever. And I further devise that all the balance of my property not before mentioned and bequeathed be sold and the proceeds thereof applied to the payment of my just debts and funeral charges. And after they are all paid should there be a remainder I devise that it be paid by my executors to my beloved wife Amanda Cameron for her use and benefit upon the same conditions of the property before mentioned and bequeathed.

Lastly. I do nominate and appoint, John Cameron and Benjamin F. Williams to be the executors of this my last and testament.
